With that approval, remodeling will be undertaken, the goal being to move into the building by June of next year. Fundraising efforts were very successful and actually achieved more than the needed \$250,000 so additional work can be done on this building. KNOW AND BE KNOWN:	The "Know and Be Known" project will eventually be used as a means to recruit volunteers, encouraging all parishioners to sign up for some form of service, e.g. even the homebound could volunteer to participate in the prayer chain. During two weekends in April, current volunteers have been recruited to give witness presentations at the weekend Masses. Volunteer forms will be distributed after these presentations. WINTERFEST:	Council members were reminded Winterfest is on March 5 th . As of February 19 th , half of the 2000 raffle tickets are sold so the raffle is at a break-even point. Terry Pasterski has additional tickets if anyone wishes to make a purchase. The two weeks before the event always have the highest sales. Information about Winterfest was only presented at the Masses on two weekends. In retrospect, the Planning Committee thinks there should have been more presentations.
