Pastoral Column

Today I walked behind a faire princess who was on a journey to her pre-K school. She was also accompanied by her Nana and older brother. Dressed in a lavender tulle skirt, wearing the required faire wings, also lavender, and a veil of tulle held on by a ring of flowers crown, she processed down the alley and street to her destination. People greeted her and remarked at how beautiful her outfit looked. The next day was the same.

As always, when fully employed as a Papa, there was a fly in the ointment; it seems her brother didn't want to go to school. It was quite dramatic. Tristan has the ability to stand silent in these situations. Not wishing to mess with his special skill, I simply picked him up and began walking to school. Papa interrupting the pose evidently reminded him that he was not with mom or dad, and so he had to move forward. We talked and he told me that school is too much. I have done homework with him so I know what he's talking about. As the readings from today suggest, I focused him on the fact of the future and reminded him, as old people often do, that we've all gone through this, and, that he is quite smart and will make it. Seeing that he cried for the entire walk, I'm not sure that the pep talk helped.

This experience reminded me of the first reading today. The writer is awash with despair that God has abandoned him to the ups and downs of life in turmoil, surrounded by violence. God reminds him of a basic truth; when you are going to the goal, the journey is often difficult. In fact, God also says that it is the difficulty of the task that makes us grow in our ability to accept the goal when we reach it. In other words, God is saying (to quote popular wisdom) there is no free lunch. When Vienna went through the work (for a two year old) to become a faire princess, she received the accolades. When Tristan went through the turmoil of crying, resistance and stormy silence, he had to put up with Papa saying "tough boogies kid. You have to go to school." Like the servant in the Gospel, by the time his sobbing walk was finished, he was happy to see friends and walk through the door.

These challenges may seem small my friends, but I remind you that to a 2 and 6 year old, they are big. We face these kinds of challenges all of the time; illness, financial despair, broken relationships, moments when one more burden will surely crush us. But, we have Jesus, Love Incarnate, who promises to be with us as we struggle and grow through our difficulties. Pain makes humans grow. It is a psychological fact that our best work is done in adversity. It is a spiritual fact that God is there, not to take on the burden, but to help carry it when we need the support. He has never broken his promise in spite of our questioning His presence. Sometimes, He's like Papa, picking us up and carrying us to the next step. Have a wonderful week.




GOSPEL TIME


The Mysteries of the Rosary

Have you ever wanted to explore the life of Jesus and Mary in a deeper way? Each decade highlights a sacred episode: **Joyful Mysteries:** Through the Annunciation (1) and Visitation (2), we get a glimpse at Mary's joyful yes to God. She gives birth to Jesus in the Nativity (3). Mary and Joseph present their son at the temple (4) and bring him there again when he is a teenager (5).

Luminous Mysteries: Jesus is baptized in the Jordan River (1) before Mary gives him a nudge to his first miracle at Cana (2). Jesus proclaims the Gospel (3), is transfigured on Mount Tabor (4), and institutes the Eucharist (5). The light is shining!

Sorrowful Mysteries: Jesus prays in agony in Gethsemane (1), knowing his hour of suffering has come. After his betrayal and arrest, Jesus is scourged (2) and crowned with thorns (3). He carries his cross (4), and Mary stands at the foot of the cross as he is crucified (5).

Glorious Mysteries: Christ is risen in glory (1)! After appearing to those he loves, he ascends into heaven (2). Jesus' followers receive the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (3). Mary, unaffected by original sin, is assumed body and soul into heaven (4), where she is crowned queen, humble mother of Christ the King (5). ©LPi

Reporting Sexual Abuse

ATTN: SCRIP CARD USERS

When you pay with scrip or a gift card, do you sometimes have a small balance left on the card? Would you consider donating that card to those in need? We often get walk-ins requesting money to purchase gas, food, or prescriptions. The small balances left on your gift cards could add up to be enough to help someone have their next meal, pick-up a prescription, or purchase gas to get to a doctor appt, an out-of-town funeral, or to work the next day. Cards can be dropped in the collection baskets, or at the Quad-Parish or Faith Formation Office. It would be helpful if you would indicate the balance left on the card.

Homebound or Nursing Home Visits/ Communion Calls

Parishioners who are unable to attend Mass due to illness or incapacity may request a Minister of Care to visit and bring Communion. Those seriously impaired by sickness or old age may also request the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Please call Sr. Jan at the Quad-Parish Office, 496-2160. If it is an emergency after hours, please call 617-8646.

To help us keep track of our parishioners, we ask that families (and neighbors) let us know when a loved one or neighbor is homebound, in a nursing home or in an assisted living facility so that we can provide visits and care. Also, please let us know if someone is receiving Hospice Care so Pastoral Care can be provided at this difficult time.

Hospitalization

Please ask admitting personnel to inform your parish whenever you or a loved one is hospitalized. If at all possible either a priest or a pastoral associate will visit. Privacy concerns do not permit the hospital to initiate the contact.
