**On Letting Easter In**

When all the world turns into love  
when birds get spastic in the trees  
when buds hurry into blossoms  
and grass starts wearing green,  
I always know that Easter wants  
to come again.

But deeper yet  
and richer still,  
when Jesus is imprisoned in us  
and he asks us  
to roll away the stone  
that keeps Him in  
then Easter wants to come again.


So let it come!  
It's awfully late for *not rising*  
and resurrection  
is the wildest news  
that's ever touched  
this crazy, mixed-up world.  
It says, **Yes!**  
when everything else says, **No!**

It says, **Up!**  
when everything else says, **Down!**  
It says, **Live!**  
when everything else says, **Die!**

Yes, Easter really wants to come so  
don't you see that stone has got to go?  
that stone of fear, of selfishness and  
pride of greed and blindness  
and all the other things we use  
to keep Jesus in the tomb.

So here's to rolling stones away to  
give Our Lord the chance He needs to  
rise and touch a troubled, lonely world.  
Some call it resurrection.  
It's wild with wonder,  
it's beautiful and real.  
Intent on throwing life around,  
it touches and it heals!

Yes, Easter, you can come!  
I'll roll the stone away and set you free.



Whenever you arrive at a destination it is an opportunity to reflect on how you got here. This morning, blessed Easter morning, as we stand at the empty tomb let's reflect back on the arrest of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. In particular, let's look at the scene through the eyes of Peter, James and John.

It is clear when you lay the four Gospels out side by side that the authors didn't always order the events in strict chronological sequence because some events are placed at different times in the Gospels. So, while we can't say for certain that the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor happened just before the events that played out in Jerusalem that final week it is likely that it was shortly before since it was a full revelation of Jesus' divinity as a capstone if you will to all that Jesus had revealed to these three most trusted Apostles during his public ministry.

How then, after witnessing the transfigured Lord could Peter, James and John abandon Jesus in his hour of need in the Garden? How could Peter go so far as to deny that he even knew who Jesus was? I think the crisis was in seeing Jesus apparently powerless. Jesus was arrested. He was bound and dragged off to trial. He had to appear helpless. And certainly as Jesus was publically tried, scourged and crucified his apparent weakness must have been a shock to Peter, James and John – probably more shocking to these three than anyone else except Mary as they had heard and seen what others had not. Isn't it the times when God is silent, when God appears powerless, when evil and danger seem to overwhelm all that our faith too can be shocked, can be traumatized?

In this time of world trial by the Corona Virus, when we witness a dangerous health threat sweep across the world and into our own communities it can seem like God is silent, God is distant, God is powerless. Like

the psalmist we cry out, "Have you abandoned us forever, has your kindness to Israel ceased?"

We know now what Peter, James and John did not. When God seems most silent, when God seems most powerless, when God seems most distant, when God seems most uncaring are the times when God plans to reveal himself, reveal his love, reveal his presence and reveal his concern for each and every person in some unimagined & glorious manner.

Jesus is raised from the dead. Jesus **is** raised from the dead! Jesus **IS Raised** from the **Dead!! Jesus Is Raised From The DEAD!!!** The same Jesus who appeared powerless, helpless and weak proved to be more powerful than death!


The stone is rolled away. Not so Jesus could come out of the tomb. He showed that when he walked right through the locked door of the upper room where the Apostles were huddled and afraid that the authorities would be coming for them next. The stone is rolled back for us. That we may enter like Peter and John. Look there and see the burial cloths left behind by Jesus forever. See and believe!

This same risen Jesus the Christ lives in the hearts of all the baptized – all those who invite Him in. Rejoice in our Saving God!



While I was studying and working in Rome for several years, I often had the chance to hear Saint John Paul II speak. He would say again and again, “Be not afraid, Be not afraid.” I hear his voice echoing in my ears and in my heart so very often.

You know what happens? When we’re afraid, we forget Jesus. We forget how Jesus is walking with us through all of this. The disciples were in the boat one time with Jesus. He was sleeping at the back of the boat and this huge storm came up. They were frightened. Probably the boat was taking on water and it was a violent, violent storm. Jesus was still asleep. Finally, He woke up. He held his hands out over the waters and said, “Be still.” All of a sudden the waters died down. It was peaceful. The disciples realized who He really was.

Take your eyes off of the storms and look into the face of Jesus.

Mother Teresa use to share a quote which I love and I have been giving it in nearly every homily that I have given since 2016 as we take our journey of Disciples on the Way.

She said, “The personal love Jesus has for you is infinite. You are special to God. He is waiting for you to come to Him in prayer. He wants to honor you with His presence. Jesus loves you tenderly. You are precious to Him. Turn to Jesus with great trust and allow yourself to be loved by Him.


He’s saying, “Here I am. I am with you always. I love you and nothing, nothing can separate you from my love.”

When you believe it, then you are free to live and to love, to trust Him and then be good to one another. Priests have said, “Be not afraid,” by continuing to celebrate Masses privately for you and for the world. They remind us via live streaming video that Jesus is still with us. He is walking with us through all of this.

Parishioners have said with their lives, “Be not afraid,” by helping those who are vulnerable and alone in their homes or in their communities, bringing them groceries and necessities and assuring them they are not abandoned or alone. In doing so you have become Jesus’ voice to the world, saying to all with words and actions, “Be not afraid.”

Thank you from the bottom of my heart for all that you are doing. God bless you and may God multiply all these prayers, and these efforts, and these outreaches and make them manifest far beyond you.

To sum up now, number one, Be not afraid. Jesus loves you and He’s walking with you through all of this. Number two, you’re already doing wonderful things to cure our world of fear. Keep reaching out with Jesus’ love in your prayers and in your actions. Three, get ready! God is doing something wonderful. When this is over He is going to need your hearts filled up with faith and your hands and feet in service and action. As you go forward in faith, and as you let Jesus be the cure of all fear in your hearts, in your homes, and in your community. I share with you my blessing, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. Be not afraid!



## THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL

JN 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.




## Offline Ministry Opportunities

**4. Growing in Faith:** We will offer resources for our parish communities as we focus on growing our faith through this unique situation. As people of faith we put our hope in Jesus Christ.

A. Resources for Prayer and Adult Faith Formation will be provided through the website, facebook and parish bulletin publications as resources become available.

B. Faith Formation classes for Children and Youth will be canceled for the remainder of the year. We hope this will be a time for our families to grow in prayer together. The faith formation staff will provide resources for families twice a week. Families Growing in Faith resources will include information and activities on a new theme each week. Family Gospel Time resources will provide age specific resources to reflect on the Mass and Sunday Gospel each weekend.

Families will be notified of dates for the Sacraments once restrictions on gathering for Masses have been lifted. Confirmation preparation is postponed until further notice.


