Where Do You Stand?

I may have shared with you that I am a completely unashamed book addict. Notice that I did not claim I've read all of them; I'm just caught up by the titles and the hype. Last year, when we were visiting the New York family, I took along a book that I purchased in the last century; *Where Do You Stand?* The book contained various topics and a review, unbiased, of ethical considerations of various issues, such as capital punishment, abortion, euthanasia, war, social justice, etc.

It appears, when this time of social isolation is lessened and we are safely able to socialize, we will be faced with this same question; *Where Do You Stand?* The issues with our current situation may include; How does the return to the Eucharist affect your life? What is the impact of returning to your community of worship? What is your view of post isolation humanity? How has this forced distancing affected you?

I have been contemplating these questions. Sometimes when I listen to the pundits, the message is filled with fears and uncertainty; a sense of dread of the future. Then faith will kick in. I am reminded that 1) God loves us, 2) Jesus saves us, 3) the Holy Spirit guides us. When we remind ourselves of these truths, we can free ourselves from fear of things that are beyond our ability to fix. Our task is to take our faith, at whatever level it exists to the higher level before us. We can re-form our relationships with others. We can re-form our communications with others. We can grow our compassion for those who are suffering around us. We can see the impact of the corona challenge on the news every evening. We see healthcare workers walking into their jobs every day, regardless of the danger. We see ordinary people spending hours helping others in food pantries. When I think of the time after the corona virus subsides, I pray that the Catholic faith we practice will continue to shine as the beacon of hope to the entire world.

DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

The Diocese of Green Bay has rolled out the first phase of guidelines for distribution of Holy Communion which consists of a short prayer service, Holy Communion, and a closing prayer. This is a starting point for us, and we will continue to update procedures as the new phases roll out. If you are interested in reading about the guidelines from the diocese, they can be found on the diocesan website.

At the Quad Parishes, beginning May 31 we will be opening two sites (St. Joseph and St. Jude) to offer three opportunities (St. Joseph Church, St. Joseph Chapel, St. Jude Church) for reception of Holy Communion on Sunday mornings, 10:30a-12:30p. This will follow the 10a livestreamed Mass. Each Communion Service will allow for 8 people at a time. The sick, immunocompromised and vulnerable (over age 65) should refrain from partaking in the Communion Services at this time. Everyone's attendance is optional, as Catholics are not required to attend Mass during this time.

We are asking that everyone who is interested in coming to a Communion Service sign up for a specific time. Sign up for the Communion Services will begin at 9a on Tuesday, May 26th by following a link on the Quad Parish website and FaceBook page. If you do not have internet, or prefer to call in, you can call the parish office (920) 496-2160 on Tues-Thurs from 9a-1p. Communion Services will be spaced 20 minutes apart. This gives us time to sanitize between services.

A flow of movement into and out of the spaces will be marked with signage, allowing us to avoid crossover. The entrance at St. Joseph will be door # 5 (blue awning). The exit at St. Joseph will be door # 6 (near the cry room and sacristy). The entrance at St. Jude will be door #1 (school door). The exit at St. Jude will be door #2 (gathering space). Please remember to be mindful and minimize what you touch so that we can sanitize quickly and efficiently following each service.

What to expect:

- You are strongly encouraged to watch the livestream Mass before attending a Communion Service but this is not mandatory.
- Arrive to your scheduled site 5 minutes prior to your planned visit.
- Use social distancing and maintain a 6 ft distance between all persons who do not reside in the same household.
- All unnecessary things should remain behind in your vehicle.
- You will be asked to wear a mask. You are encouraged to bring a mask to wear during the service; we will have a limited supply at the church for those who do not have them.
- Please refrain from touching things unnecessarily.
- The entrance door will be propped open so that you may enter without contact.
- Everyone's temperature will be taken at the door. Those with a temperature over 100.3 will not be permitted entry.
- Hand sanitizer will be available for you at the entrance.
- There will be a short prayer service, then the reception of Communion followed by a closing prayer.
- You are encouraged to receive Communion in the hand.
- A basket will be available for you to place contribution envelopes in.
- The exit will also be propped open to avoid contact.

The May 31st bulletin will have information regarding Daily Mass and the opening of the Quad Parish Office.

We have done our best to preserve palms and some will be available at the exits on May 31st for those who would like one.



PRIEST TRANSITIONS

The Diocese of Green Bay has announced transfers and new assignments for priests throughout the Diocese. The Quad-Parish communities have been informed that both Fr. Dave and Fr. Greg will be getting new assignments beginning August 3, 2020. We appreciate the time and opportunities we have had to grow in faith with Fr. Dave and Fr. Greg. On August 3, 2020 we will welcome Fr. Antonio de los Santos as our new Administrator for the parishes. He will be joined by another international priest who will serve as parochial vicar. While this transition does not come at the most ideal time, we trust the Holy Spirit will guide us in faith.

To the Quad Parish family,

To say that this is a crazy time is an understatement. No one wants to add more pain or questions to your lives when you are already dealing with so much. Change brings about pain and questions. If you have not yet heard, I will be leaving the Quad Parishes as of August. Due to retirements, International Priests returning home, and ordinations twenty-one parishes in our diocese are affected with personnel changes. You need to know it was my choice for the transition. I believe this change will be good for the parishes, the pastoral team and myself.

There will be two priests sent to replace me and Fr. Greg. Fr. Antonio de los Santos is one. The other priest has not yet been named.

I am confident that you will welcome them as wonderfully and graciously as you welcomed me. Thank you for the prayers, support and challenges that help me to be the best priest I can be. More information will follow in future bulletins and the parish web-pages.

I know that it is never easy to change priests, but of course we still have two-and-a-half months together! As always, I am available by phone and email, which are both on the parish website and in the bulletin, but I am also very hopeful that I will be able to see all of you in person again before I go. I love you all and will treasure the time I have been privileged to spend with you. Know always of my prayers, and most importantly know that God is spending every second of every day trying to tell you how much He loves you. Never stop trying to love Him back!

They worshiped but they doubted.


Do you, like the disciples, have doubts about who Jesus is? what your faith is all about? how God is working in your life? What can you do to strengthen your faith?

A. Resources for Prayer and Adult Faith Formation will be provided through the website, facebook and parish bulletin publications as resources become available.


