The readings for today's liturgy are very short but hold a very powerful message. Our God is merciful, gracious, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity. Savor these words and let them take root in your heart if they haven't already.

Like the Israelites in the first reading we need to ask ourselves, if we too, are a stiff-necked people. Who is the God we believe in? Is our God a God of vengeance? Are we angry with God because God doesn't intervene when evil things happen to good people? Is God a strict parent up in the heavens that we forget about until we face some danger we can't control? Then God better answer when we beg for help or we jump to the conclusion God doesn't care or God doesn't exist.


In the Gospel John assures us that God isn't like any of these things but sent his beloved Son to save us, not condemn us. God literally wants all of us to be with Him for all eternity. Our problem is that we've gotten so caught up in our culture of individualism and consumerism we find it hard to develop a personal relationship with this Trinity of Love.

Our God is LOVE, unconditional love. That literally means that only good ever comes from God. If there is any negative associated with whatever we are thinking, then it isn't from God. Either God is LOVE or God is not. There is a great mystery here. We are made in God's image (pure love) and we are each a child of God!

God works through all things for our good. I can't help but wonder if this time of the pandemic isn't our time to go out into the desert with Jesus, led by the Spirit, to develop or refresh a deeper relationship with our God so that our days here on earth can be rich in meaning and purpose.

Take the time to ask yourself, "What is it, Lord, that you want me to learn from this challenging time in history?" Then, ask yourself what your response is to the Spirit at work within you.

Return to Public Mass June 13 & 14

Last week, the Diocese of Green Bay rolled out the next phase - a return to public mass. At the Quad Parishes, we too are making preparations and would like to share some of the guidelines and give you a good sense of what it is going to look like.

We are asked to maintain a limit of 25% capacity for mass attendance, therefore, we are going to continue with a reservation system to ensure that everyone is able to find a place at a mass. The link will be updated weekly and found in the Quad Parish bulletin, facebook page, and website. Those without the internet have the option to contact the parish office for reservation assistance. The link for June 13/14 Mass (and Adoration) reservations is: <https://reopen.church/r/BmqqWjG4>.

Here are a few of the more detailed pieces, which you can expect to observe:

Doors will be propped open for contact free entrance into the churches.

- Hand sanitizer available at the entrances of the church.
- Holy Water fonts will remain empty.
- Mask use continues to be encouraged.
- The greeting and sign of peace will be omitted.
- Bulletins will be available for distribution at the end of Mass.
- Please continue to use social distancing practices as you enter and exit the churches, as well as when you come forward for communion.
- The facilities will be cleaned & sanitized following services.

NOTE: Renovations are now complete at St Patrick. Their 4 pm Mass will be held in St Patrick Church.


In addition to the things listed in the article above, we would like to let you know that the diocese has asked us to remove all printed materials from the churches. This includes, but is not limited to hymnals and worship aids. Once we are able to return to using printed materials, single use worship aids will be the norm, and it is safe to count on that continuing for quite a while.

It is important to note that the dispensation from the Sunday Obligation of the Mass remains during this time. The faithful should use their best judgment as to whether or not to attend. Catholics who are not sick or frail due to illness or age are encouraged to return to Mass.

Those who are showing symptoms of illness, even if not COVID related, in the spirit of Christian charity, should choose to remain at home.



Beginning Tuesday, June 16, weekday morning masses will resume with 25% capacity. Since attendance at the morning mass is considerably below 25% capacity, the masses will be open to anyone who wants to attend. Specific safety directives will be published next week. Thank you for your patience and understanding as we work through all the details.

Saturday, June 13th**

Along with a highly anticipated return to our public celebration of Mass at the Quad Parishes, we are excited to share that Fr. Greg will be leading a procession with the Blessed Sacrament.

On Sat, June 13th, following 4pm Mass at St. Jude, a procession with the Blessed Sacrament will walk one mile down Division St to Annunciation (enter Gray St doors). Those in procession can say a personal rosary or follow in silent prayer as we follow the Blessed Sacrament to Annunciation church. At 5:15p, upon the arrival of the procession, we will begin an hour of Adoration, Music and Confession.

We are asking that those who desire time in Prayer and Adoration, following the procession, sign up on the reservation link that can be found in the Quad Parish bulletin (see below), facebook page, and website. Those without the internet have the option to contact the parish office for reservation assistance. The link for June 13th & 14th Mass (and Adoration) reservations is: <https://reopen.church/r/BmqqWjG4>.

Sign up is required so that we are able to keep within the 25% capacity guidelines set by the Diocese of Green Bay.

As with all of our services, the faithful should use their best judgment as to whether or not to attend. Those who are showing symptoms of illness, even if not COVID related, in the spirit of Christian charity, should choose to remain at home.

We will not be arranging transportation between the churches this year.

If it is raining, Adoration will be held after mass at St. Jude (any reservations made for the Adoration at Annunciation will transfer to the space at St. Jude).

The Holy Spirit gifts us with all we need to respect and preserve the dignity of all people and creation. Choose to use those gifts well recognizing God's presence with you always.

Whoever believes in him will not be condemned.

If God loves us so much that he will not condemn us as we strive to live rightly, then we in turn should not condemn others. Instead we need to allow the healing grace of Jesus, the love of the Father, and the communion of the Spirit to pour over us and everything we do.



Prayer Opportunity


St. Patrick Oratory will have St. Patrick Church open for prayer at the following times.




Offline Ministry Opportunities



Parish offers drive-through meals

KAUKAUNA — It wasn't mana in the desert or a multiplication of loaves and fishes, but the drive-through community meal May 14 sponsored by Kaukauna Catholic Parishes did demonstrate how faith can bring people together to satisfy physical and spiritual hunger.

Approximately 600 meals — each featuring a choice of bratwurst, hot dog, hamburger or a vegetarian salad — were prepared and served by about 20 parish volunteers in the parking lot of St. Katharine Drexel-St. Mary Church. Other volunteers helped cars maneuver through the four serving lanes divided by traffic cones.

"It has been a wonderful opportunity to do what we can to raise the spirits of people in the city of Kaukauna and (in) Hollandtown in a very simple way," said Fr. Don Everts, pastor of Kaukauna Catholic Parishes, who took orders and handed bagged meals to guests.

Volunteers wore masks and gloves as they directed traffic, took food orders and handed the meals to drivers.

It was the second week in

a row the parish sponsored a community meal, said Gloria Schuh, parish discipleship coordinator. "We had 52 jars of spaghetti sauce (left over from the St. Ignatius School lunch program) and we were like, 'How can we use this,'" said Schuh. With a donation from Catholic Financial Life, the parish's inaugural community meal, held May 7, fed spaghetti

and meatballs to nearly 400 people.

"People are out of work and they need a good meal and budgets are stretched thin," said Fr. Everts. "That's one of the reasons" for having the drive-through meal in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Neenah parish breaks bread in middle of pandemic

NEENAH — At this time of year, children usually come to church for first Communion. Due to the coronavirus pandemic, first Communions have been delayed and children, and their families, have had to stay home and not attend Mass at church.

So instead of people coming to church for blessed bread, St. Gabriel church staff in

Neenah went to people's homes with freshly baked bread.

Meredith Lauer, youth ministry and faith formation coordinator at St. Gabriel, came up with the idea of delivering 200 loaves of bread to all the students in the parish's faith formation classes from first through 11th grades, including confirmation students and second graders who are preparing for first Communion.

"All I can say is that it was inspired by the Holy Spirit," Lauer told The Compass. "I like bread. My kids like bread. And I thought, 'Oh it would be such a fun thing to do.' It's the end of our religious education year and I thought it would be nice to be able to see them and say 'Goodbye.' And bread came to mind. I don't know why."

5 THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

St. Boniface

- 1 June 5 is the memorial of St. Boniface. While it's summer, Boniface has ties to Christmas trees.
- 2 Boniface was born in England. His name was Winfrid. Later, he was called "Boniface" which means "good order" in Latin (bonum facere).
- 3 In 719 A.D., Winfrid became a missionary to tribes in what is now Germany.
- 4 The tribes followed local gods, including Donar, who later became known as Thor.
- 5 Winfrid chopped down a sacred tree called "Donar's Oak." An evergreen was found behind it, so Winfrid told them to use it as a symbol of God's eternal love. This tradition later led to the German Christmas tree.

An update on public celebration of Mass

Dear friends and followers of Jesus:

Over these two months of "safer at home," I have been continually inspired by the innovation and creativity I have seen from our priests, pastoral leaders and parish and school staffs as they have ministered to the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of the faithful throughout the Diocese of Green Bay. It is during these challenging times that our Lord walks with us to be bolder and better. Now is our time to "love all God's people, all the time!" I extend my most heartfelt thanks to everyone in the parishes and schools for rising in the days of Easter to serve those who are just looking to find some normalcy in this time of the coronavirus pandemic.

I also want to share I too, have been hard at work with my brother bishops throughout the state, curia leadership and with the Regional Vicars and Presbyteral Council to bring our church and her members back to the source and summit of our faith, which has been missing for so many during these two months. The health and safety of the faithful is our number one priority. And, I want to be clear we will continue to comply with the safer-at-home policies as long as they are in place.

As we issue this plan, we see the diocese as being in the pre-phase of the "Bounce Back Plan." As you may know, the Archdiocese of Milwaukee issued their plan for returning to Mass several weeks ago. Our plan is different and takes into account the particular circumstances of our diocese. Because of concern for those living in the northern counties of the diocese, who are not projected to see spikes in the virus until perhaps mid-July, we will remain vigilant in our observance of our plan and our monitoring and measuring of data.

Last week, I shared with priests and pastoral leaders our plan for the "Distribution of Holy Communion" outside the Mass on Sundays during the coronavirus pandemic. The solution the church has provided, and which we are implementing beginning Pentecost weekend, May 30-31, is a simple Communion service. Parishioners who are able are strongly encouraged to participate spiritually at Mass by means of television, online or radio before coming to a parish Communion service. Those who are unable to do so are encouraged to read the Scriptures for the day or pray a rosary or in some other way prepare to receive holy Communion. The Communion service will include reading briefly from the Word of God, praying the Lord's Prayer together, and receiving the Eucharist, providing an opportunity for the faithful to be sacramentally nourished.


