


When my customers responded well, I did more.'



If schools are closed due to weather, the Faith Formation Center, Hope Center Pantry and Love Life will be closed. If there is a 2-hour delay, the pantry and Love Life will be open. Every attempt will be made to have the Quad-Parish and Faith Formation Office open, but please call before coming since we may get in late or leave early. Our main concern is keeping everyone safe and we don't want you coming to the office if it is not open. This policy is in effect for the Parish and the Faith Formation Office.
