

See and Believe by Deacon Dan

Do you ever think about the confusion of the resurrection stories from the four Gospels? Let's lay the Gospels side by side: In Matthew, as Mary Magdalene and the other Mary are going to the tomb there is an earthquake as an angel rolls back the stone from Jesus' tomb. In Mark, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome are going to the tomb and they find that the stone is already rolled back. Luke's Gospel gives no names of who goes to the tomb; he just refers to them as "they". These people encounter two angels. John in his Gospel only says that Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and when she sees the stone rolled away she runs back to get Peter and John.

In Mark, the angel tells the women that Jesus is risen and they are to go tell his disciples, so the women departed quickly in great joy. In Mark's Gospel the women fled from the tomb, trembling and astonished, and afraid. Luke has the women return to the disciples quietly and calmly. In John's Gospel it is Peter and John, who on Mary Magdalene's report run to the tomb to find it empty.

In Matthew's Gospel Jesus himself then appears to the women and directs them to tell the disciples to go to Galilee. And it is in Galilee that Jesus appears to them, gives them the great commission to baptize the nations and proclaim the Gospel. In Mark, the disciples do not believe the women. They persist in their unbelief until Jesus appears to them. Luke also suggests the disciples unconvinced. In John, Peter and John run back to tell the rest of the disciples while Mary Magdalene remains at the tomb, weeping. She then looks into the tomb and sees two angels, and then she sees Jesus who, at first, she mistakes as the gardener. John is the only one who mentions the detail of the burial cloths. Only Luke tells us of Jesus appearing to the two disciples on the road to Emmaus. Luke and John tell us of Jesus appearing to the apostles in the upper room, but only John adds the story of Thomas not being present the first time.

Personally, I love all this apparent confusion. For me it adds to the authenticity of all of the Gospels. There were, in fact, many moving parts that first Easter morning and day. There were all the emotions swirling – mourning, fear, amazement, doubt, joy, excitement, confusion. Part of our trouble as rational humans we try to imagine the Gospel story as one story that played out sequentially, scene by scene. Why do we think that the risen Jesus could only be at one place at one time, speaking with one person? All of these details are included because there is important truth in all of them. They speak of the real struggles of humans (like us), even believers (like us), to get minds and hearts around the awesome reality that Jesus is risen; he is risen indeed!
