

"We were really great friends all throughout our childhood," Michelle said. "When we came back from college, we started dating. We got married in August of 2013, so this August we will have been married for 10 years." The couple wanted to start expanding their family and both were interested in adoption.

"Even before we were married, we talked about how we always wanted to adopt," Michelle said. "We wanted to have children of our own, but also adopt one or two children. We found out it was unlikely we would be able to get pregnant on our own. We began our adoption journey officially the day after we found out."

Seven churches visitation set for Holy Thursday in Green Bay

GREEN BAY — This year, Bishop David Ricken and the Diocese of Green Bay will resume a Holy Thursday tradition that was put on hold due to COVID-19 in 2020 — the Seven Churches Eucharistic Visitation.

The visitation is ancient in the Catholic Church. In the Diocese of Green Bay, the

current devotion was started in 2015.

The Seven Churches Eucharistic Visitation begins after the Mass of the Lord's Supper and the transfer of the Eucharist to the altar of repose. After prayer, the faithful travel to seven local churches and honor the last hours of Jesus' earthly life.

This year's visitation will reflect upon the

Seven Last Words of Christ — one word, (often a sentence) at each of the churches.

"The gift of the Seven Churches Visitation after Holy Thursday services is an opportunity to enter into communion with Christ in his Agony in the Garden.

5 THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

The Gloria

1 The Gloria, along with the Alleluia, is not used at Mass during Lent — except on solemnities and feasts. The absence is a reminder of Lent's penitential nature.

2 The Gloria is sometimes called "the Angelic Hymn" because it comes from Luke's Gospel about the Nativity (2:14).

The Gloria was first used for Morning Prayer in the early church and was then prayer in Greek.

4 Tradition says St. Hilary of Poitiers translated it into Latin in the fourth century. It was added to the Mass, first at Christmas and then for each Sunday and solemnity by the sixth century.

5 The Gloria is known as the "Greater Doxology of the Mass." Doxology literally means "words of praise." (The Lesser Doxology is what we call the "Glory Be.")

Faithful Citizenship in Wisconsin

ecently I had the opportunity to meet with two new staff people from the Wisconsin Catholic Conference (WCC). The WCC serves as the

Bishop David Ricken public policy voice of the Catholic Church in the State of Wisconsin. Working at the direction of the bishops of each of the five dioceses of Wisconsin, staff at the WCC work with our legislators and citizens to help them understand Catholic Social Teaching and how the Gospel applies to public policy issues. They are a great resource to me and to

the church in Wisconsin.

I am sharing about the WCC because sometimes we get so focused on the political issues taking place at the national level that we ignore what is going on in our own state. While the issues at the state level may not get the publicity of the national issues, they often have a greater impact on the lives of each of us.

There are two especially important political issues going on in Wisconsin right now: the State Supreme Court election, which will take place on April 4, and the state budget which gets approved every two years.

Both the election and the budget will have a significant impact on our state in the years to come, addressing a variety of issues from education and jobs to healthcare and housing to abortion and redistricting.

Given the importance of these issues, I urge you to take seriously your responsibility as faithful citizens of Wisconsin. Specifically, I would encourage you to pray, educate and advocate.
