Silence is Not Always Golden



Lately I have had the opportunity to have several conversations with friends, parishioners and other church folk about the state of the church. In each of the conversations It was apparent to me that everyone I was chatting with had great love and compassion for their parishes and for the Church, as a whole. They spoke of the great joy that they have found as they came to know Jesus in a deep and personal way. Smiles widened when they mentioned the many friends that they had made through church activities, volunteering for ministries, committees and social events and by attending Mass. It was obvious to me that they had received a great deal from their involvement.

Because they care so much for Jesus, their community and the Church, they carry some serious concerns as well. They wonder where the young people are. They question the decrease in contributions of funds and time to the church. They ask why Mass attendance seemed to be so low and they lament about the perceived decline in respect and value of life. Like I do their joys, I sympathize with their concerns, as well. I have asked myself similar questions.

As the conversations continued, I began to wonder if these were concerns unique to modern times. I suspect that they are not. If I had to guess, I'd predict that this type and tone of conversation has been going on for decades or centuries or since there has been "younger generations". Times change and I am starting to realize that it can be hard to change with them. Over the years I have learned a few things that I have come to believe as true, right and good. I have also learned a particular way to live with these things as my guides. I have been blessed with wonderful teachers and role models. The challenge now is to pass that knowledge on.*

*Throughout the Easter season we hear stories from the Acts of the Apostles during Mass. These passages give us insight into how the pupils of Jesus grew to become teachers of the Good News that Jesus taught them. Of course, we are called to do the same. I would suggest that some of the struggles that our world faces today are due to our own shortcomings as teachers of the next generations. As tempting as it is to blame the kids for this, that or the other thing, perhaps we should start with asking ourselves what we have done and what we are doing to spread the Good News.

- Are we talking about Jesus and His Love for all people? Are we acting like we believe it?
- Are we judgmental?
- Are we being kind and loving?
- Are we humble or is self-righteousness a more accurate description?
- Is "because I say so" or "that's the way I do it so it must be right" a common approach for us?

It is not my suggestion that we shy away from the Truth. God is our creator and source of everlasting life. Jesus did come to teach us perfect love and to save us from sin. In fact, if we are not standing up for these truths, I believe that we are, in fact, responsible for the ills that are trying to take over our lives.

We must speak the truth. We must be honest with others and with ourselves. We do have the power and the ability to change the trajectory of our parishes, our community and our world. But, we cannot do it alone. We need to act - guided by God. We are called to go out and spread the Good News. How are you going to do that this week?







Good To Know

Dear Parishioners,

If you or a family member is ever in the hospital, please know that you can call the parish directly to let us know. Often times we are unaware of parishioners who are in the hospital and a call to the Quad Parish office would help us in knowing this. Changes in regulations protecting patient confidentiality are in effect at all hospitals. Even when the hospital asks if they may notify us of your admission and you answer "yes", it is still helpful if you or a family member notifies us directly, especially if someone needs to receive the **Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick**. Due to HIPPA regulations the hospitals are not able to notify us of a patient's condition, which is why your help in letting us know directly would be very helpful. You can also call the Pastoral Care Department at any hospital to notify us on your behalf. .

Article 1421 in the Catechism of the Catholic Church states: The Lord Jesus Christ, physician of our souls and bodies, who forgave the sins of the paralytic and restored him to bodily health, has willed that his Church continue, in the power of the Holy Spirit, his work of healing and salvation, even among her own members. This is the purpose of the two sacraments of healing: the sacrament of Penance and the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.



The Burden of Debt
