





THE GIFT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Jesus' love for the apostles is so much greater than they could comprehend. How many times does Jesus ask them if they have been with him for so long, and yet they see & understand so little?

That's why today's feast is so important. Like the rest of the Jewish people, the apostles expected the Messiah. But no first century Jew expected their Messiah to die on a cross as a common criminal. Can you even begin to imagine what agony of mind the apostles went through as they desert Jesus and leave him to his own demise? Their leader not only died scandalously but they have no clue how to proceed or even if to proceed.

They had a hard time too grasping the resurrection. They refused to believe the women's story that Jesus rose from the dead. Even after they had seen him, the wounds on his body, his ability to eat and touch him, they still didn't recognize him on the shore after their night of fishing.

They did wait as Jesus asked them to. The event was so dramatic-a mighty, roaring wind filled the house, tongues of fire appeared above their heads, and suddenly they were speaking in tongues, all kinds of languages that enabled them to leave their fears where they had gathered and to walk outside and begin speaking to a hefty crowd of well over 3000 people.

That same Holy Spirit is just as operative today as the Spirit was at that first Pentecost. The Spirit is in each one of us, gifting us with special gifts so that we have the grace necessary to become what God has given us the potential to become. But God also gave us a free will & God respects that free will even if we don't.

God patiently waits for us to accept the gifts and grace that await us if we ask for them. So, I invite you to consider saying this prayer to the Hoy Spirit each morning; ask the Holy Spirit to be your guide for the new day.

Come Holy Spirit

Help me to replace the business of my life with a simpler lifestyle, so I will focus on the deeper things in life and allow time for others.

Calm me when I am anxious & troubled about many things.

Help me to have the courage to empty myself of everything that does not contribute to the transformation of your beautiful world.

Feed me with the finest wheat of your joy, peace and love.

Be my wisdom as I search for meaning in a world fraught with so much pain, suffering, hostility, violence, and division.

Keep my hungry for you, Source of Life, so that I will always ache and yearn a bit for you. Amen.
