United in faith, we make our renewed commitment to praise and adore the Trinity – the undivided unity – as we go through the challenges of ordinary life.

As we profess the Blessed Trinity, we make the sign of the cross: "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." AMEN.





With some guidance and direction, this may help some parishes to hear music again, or at least have some singing leadership.


Throughout the church's history, a great variety of instruments have been used to celebrate praise to God. From the Ark of the Covenant to the Church of our present time, there has been change. So, keep in mind that there has been a variety of instruments in the Churches past. (Clanging symbols, drums, trumpets, harps, organs, piano, guitar etc.)

Times change, people change and, music changes along with our modern generation's way of thinking. When I say modern, each generation thinks their age is modern, so here comes modern change. We need musicians in our parishes, no matter what the instrument is, but to some extent. Yet, we really don't want to have a "tuba" as a lead

instrument, although its sounds good in a polka band. What I am trying to say is, today's youth can participate with a touch of their (today's) style of music within the liturgy. Again, depending on the instrument, we can, and should be open to their style of expression within bounds.

Listen, expression with direction, give the youth a chance to participate. We want the youth back in church, and what better way than to get them involved than with music. "Let the children come to me, the Kingdom belongs to such as these, happiness can always be, become like children and see." (JB-1988)

No matter what your age, we come together as one in the Eucharist, if you truly believe we are one. Let go of the past, embrace the present, and hope for the future. We are ONE with the Jesus Christ. Music brings happiness and enlivens the soul, brings on happiness, so let's bring on today's modern youth movement.
