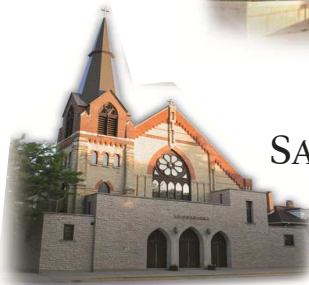

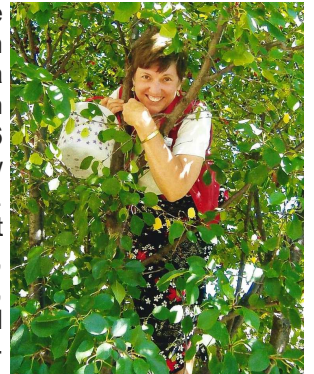

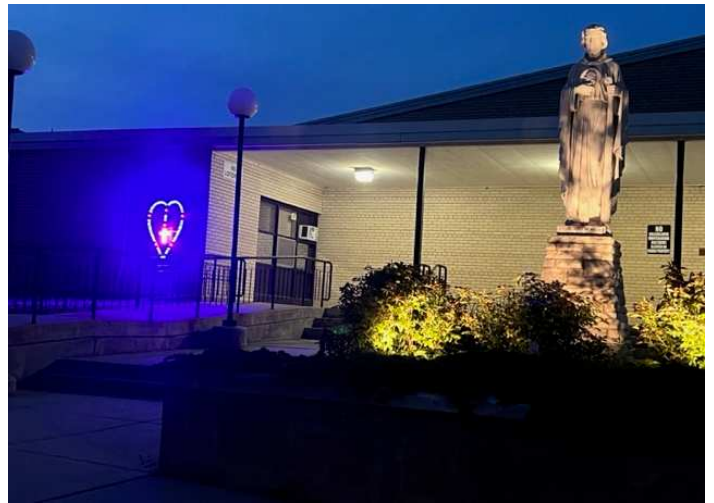

"LIFE IN TODAY'S WORLD OF MUSIC " by Jim Bertler

In today's world, there is a variety of music that we can listen to, but in this article, I will touch on Church Music. Since the Church started using music to enhance the celebration for its devotions, Mass and novenas, we learn to create appropriate music for the different occasions or celebrations. Yet, for some of the elderly who have grown up with a certain style of music, change may and can be a little difficult. Life in today's world, especially with our youth, music is important to keep their attention and interest. All liturgical events that are held in Church, should and must be appropriate and done with reverence. Music for a Mass is different than that for a novena, stations of the Cross and other devotions. So, the criteria of music would be different for each celebration. But, again "Life in Today's World of Music" should be energetic and motivated for the occasion. Music is so important in today's liturgies, and it should be inviting to all who attend these services. Along with music, the wording in today's texts should be in today's modern language, so it's more meaningful. This again, is where in today's world, there is change. Think about the changes that have occurred with cars, boats, clothing, interpretation of words that have a different meaning in today's world. We learn to accept change in these situations, but find change difficult in liturgical events. Now, don't get me wrong, the Mass, novena's and such should remain the same, I'm talking about the music and wording. THINK: I think of Jesus celebrating the first Mass in a room with his apostles which we call our Lord's last supper. A wooden dinner table to host and celebrate with the apostles and, to let them know what is about to happen, and how they are to remember this night. From a wooden table to a marble altar, talk about change. What about the dress of everyday clothing to expensive ritual attire? Aren't these some changes that took place throughout the centuries in the Church. Jesus preached in the Temple and on hillsides outside of town, and today our priest speaks from the pulpit in the Church. Another change? Let's look to the past when gathering to worship God. We have Temples, Chapels, Synagogues, and Church's, but the object is still the same to "praise God." So, "Life in Today's World of Music," should not be something that you should be afraid of or think is scandalous or being non-reverent. As certain rites within the Catholic Church switch from Latin to English in the Mass, did our faith change because of the language? When we stop using communion rails, did receiving the sacrament of Communion change our outlook on the Holy Eucharist? For those who are musical ministers at Church, you have a great deal in restoring emotions and enabling souls to become closer to God. Music is so very important in today's liturgies, and believe me, it does stir emotions! Again, change is good and is important for each generation as they change their outlook on life. Look and read about the changes from the Old Testament to the New Testament when it comes to charity. (an eye for an eye) Looking at life in today's world with respect to music, there certainly is a variety to choose from. Keep in mind that it also depends on the occasion. . Yesterday's music was good for its time, but as life goes on, so does the art and the sound of music for today.
