# **Transfiguration** By Sr Jan

Transfigure us, O Lord, transfigure us, O Lord. Break the chains that bind us, Speak your healing word, And where you lead we'll follow, Transfigure us O Lord.

This is the song we sing on this Sunday at Mass. It speaks to us of many areas of transformation, conversion, adjusting, remaking & healing such as:

- Light for those in darkness, trapped in sickness and depression, or in drugs, alcohol, pornography, gambling or anything that takes up our time and turns us in on self and away from others.
- The hungry will be filled, the thirsty will have water, the sick will have medical care, the lonely in nursing homes or their own homes will have visitors.
- Family ills will be healed; sinners pardoned, families who are at odds or broken apart will come together.
- Workplaces that are divided or controlled from on top will be places where we all have a say, we all count, and we all are valued.
- Handicapped persons will be accepted and welcomed in our world, given dignity and respect. Unborn children will be protected. Those who are of different sexual orientation or gender identity than we will be loved respected, safe and welcomed in our world.



It speaks to us of our Shepherd who leads us to carry His love to others, to lift those who are fallen, to accompany those who struggle to keep going or to lead those who do not see the path. We do this with light from the transfigured Christ.

Transfigure and transubstantiate have a commonality. In both, Jesus appears in all His glory to humankind.

The bread and wine become Jesus for us and for others. Receiving the Eucharist, we are being transformed into His Image. The more we grow in grace, prayer, good deeds and sacraments, the more we are changed into His likeness from one degree of glory to another. (2 Cor. 3:18)

# Would You Sponsor A Meal?




We are looking for volunteers to prepare a meal for the NEW Community Shelter on a 4th Monday of the month. We typically serve around 200 people.
