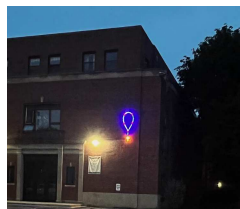
MOTHER TERESA RELIC

Sr. Anne Marie Selinsky & Sr. Nancy Kinate Celebrating 60 years as a Sister of Franciscan Sisters of Christian Charity

Sr. Anne Marie's family moved to Green Bay in 1950. She was a student at St. Joseph School, 1950-1957. She graduated 8th grade in 1957 and moved to Manitowoc to attend high school at the convent in Manitowoc. In 2004 she returned to Green Bay to care for her mother who could no longer live alone. They attended Mass at St. Joseph. When St Joseph became a part of the quads, they started attending daily Mass at off four of the parishes and got to know people from the other three parishes. Her first 5 years in Green Bay, she helped out by bringing Communion to a few homebound people and was also in charge of changing the marquee sign on 9th St at St Joseph. By time 2009 rolled around she was a full-time volunteer setting up the ministry to the homebound, the hospitalized, those in nursing homes and helped with funerals. After formally retiring in 2019, she continues to volunteer on a limited basis in various pastoral ministries.

Sr. Nancy Kinate taught 8th grade at St. Joseph School in 1984-1985, and returned as principal, 1986-1989 and then again 1990-1993. She was the last sister principal at St. Joseph. Lay principals took over when she left in 1993.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - August 13, 2023

A man at my parish was struggling to overcome a habitual sin. He said to me, "Father, I know the chance that I will commit sin again is really high. Why should I keep confessing my sins? Isn't that dishonest?" Anyone who has felt the tyrannical power of sin — and who hasn't? — has pondered this kind of question.

I responded to him, "What was the probability Peter would walk on the stormy water?" After some silence, he said, "Zero. But when Jesus called, he did it." I could tell my penitent friend was re-framing the question from his own

weakness to the greatness of the Lord's love for him. The question for us should not be one of human probabilities about our sin, but rather whether or not we will trust the Lord's grace in our lives.

This week the Lord is calling you and me to do the impossible: overcome sin with love. The only way to do that is to trust *he* is calling, and then to walk with the eyes of faith locked on him. And if we sink, he will raise us up again and again. Of that, we can be 100% sure.

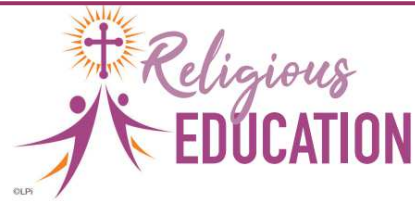

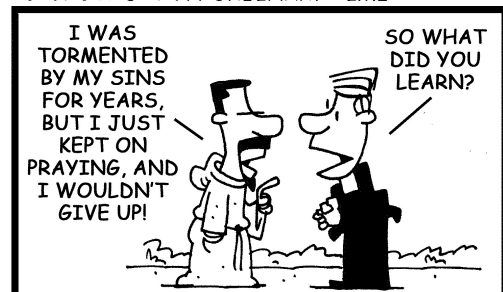

GOOD TO KNOW

Dear Parishioners,

If you or a family member is ever in the hospital and you would like a visit from a priest or a pastoral associate from the parish, please know that you can call the parish directly to let us know. Often times we are unaware of parishioners who are in the hospital and a call to the Quad Parish office would help us in knowing this. Changes in regulations protecting patient confidentiality are in effect at all hospitals. Even when the hospital asks if they may notify us of your admission and you answer “yes”, it is still helpful if you or a family member notifies us directly, especially if someone needs to receive the **Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick**. Due to HIPPA regulations the hospitals are not able to notify us of a patient’s condition, which is why your help in letting us know directly would be very helpful. You can also call the Pastoral Care Department at any hospital to notify us on your behalf.

Visiting hospitalized parishioners is an important part of our ministry. Help us to find you and/or your family members when hospitalized - a “YES” answer to “Notify parish?” will usually put you on our parish lists, but it is always a good idea to notify the Parish Office directly to make sure we are notified and also so that we know the patient’s condition since the hospital does not release this information to us unless you specifically ask them to. Your help in this matter will help us to be of better service to you.

Article 1421 in the Catechism of the Catholic Church states: *The Lord Jesus Christ, physician of our souls and bodies, who forgave the sins of the paralytic and restored him to bodily health, has willed that his Church continue, in the power of the Holy Spirit, his work of healing and salvation, even among her own members. This is the purpose of the two sacraments of healing: the sacrament of Penance and the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.*

Everyday Stewardship

I remember when all three of my children were learning to swim. In the beginning, it seemed like no matter how much assurance I gave them, they were certain they would drown. Even after watching me float in the water, they were pretty sure their bodies were created to sink. In time, they grew more comfortable in the water. Eventually, they could even swim the length of the pool. But this did not happen overnight. They had to grow in their faith that swimming was possible, not just for others, but for them as well.

Too many of us who are Christians believe that holiness is for someone else. We believe that the stories of the saints are about super humans who had something in greater supply than us. When our faith is weak, we assume that we can never have the faith of these holy men and women.

On the contrary, faith and holiness are not things only possible for a few. But we must practice our faith to grow in our faith. We must strive for holiness if we are to become holy.

Like a child fears the water before learning to swim, we often fear the path that leads to greater faith or holiness. We are not convinced that God can work in our lives to create a saint. Yet except for Mary, the Immaculate Conception, every saint was a sinner. God called every saint to exit the boat and walk toward Jesus on the water. In time, with practice and trust in God, they found they did not sink either.
