

#### How Close Are You To Jesus? by Jim Bertler

When you step forward to receive the Eucharist during Mass, it's the greatest commitment and acceptance of Jesus in your daily life. The apostles were the first to believe and accept this offering (sacrament) at the last supper. Can you imagine at that time the significance of this sacrament taking place at that table. Also, just to believe what is actually taking place in the breaking of the bread, and the significance of the wine. What if Jesus came today and asked you to "come follow me?" After several years of listening to Him preach, then took you a room & performed this ritual of remembrance, what would you be thinking? If Jesus came today and did what he has done in the past, would he take you to a supper club? Today, there are stories about miracles that happen about the host, and how people have been converted and, especially when it has been scientifically proven to be real blood. A number of vears ago. I knew a religious order priest who was ordained for a number of years, and one day at the altar while celebrating Mass he told me, something different happened to me as I was celebrating Mass. "I have come to understand and believe in the will of God, the life I have chosen and finally, what I am doing in His name." Until then, he went through the motions daily and accepted this way of life. Now life and, this sacrament of transformation had changed him greatly. He was a priest, teacher and, vice-principle for a religious Brothers school. "How close are you to Jesus?" When will it happen in your life that you believe and, are totally committed to Jesus the Savior? The holy Eucharist is the closest we get to Jesus during our daily lives. Keep in mind that it is the "bread of life."

Think how events would be different today, especially if Jesus wanted to start a membership society with His apostles to preach His good-news and outlook on life today. What kind of car would He drive? What motel or hotels would He stay at? What fast food restaurants would he frequent? Would Jesus have to get permits to preach at schools or universities? Oh yes my fellow parishioners, changes keep changing throughout our lives and we have to learn to accept this fact. Look at all the new inventions, cell phones, big screen T.V.'s, transportation and different life-styles throughout the centuries. Keep in mind that the Bible has not change nor our Catholic principals. Yet today we have people who claim to be Catholic, but do not fellow the Catholic teachings, "how close to Jesus are these people?" We must maintain our faith and live life as though Jesus is walking along side of us. Again, learn to accept change, keep Sunday dedicated to Jesus (God) and receive the body and blood of Jesus with an open heart and total commitment to His way of life. Then we will be close to Jesus our brother and Savior. So, I ask you again: How close are you to Jesus?


### Would You Sponsor A Meal?
