

FallFest Chili Recipe

Chili freezes well so start making yours now!

2.5 lbs ground beef 2-3 chopped onions

1 chopped green pepper

2-1 lb cans kidney beans 3-15 oz tomato sauce

3-4 Tbsp chili powder 2 tsp salt 1/4 tsp cayenne pepper 1/4 tsp cumin

2-1 lb cans chopped tomatoes
