

Carrying Our Cross By Dcn Jerry




The gospel today is about carrying our cross. Jesus tells us that he is always with us to help us carry our cross. I never thought much about this. Three years ago I was confronted for the first time with a serious illness. I was having problems walking and falling and tripping. I went to the doctor and after several doctors examinations they found that I had a disease where the protein is eating my muscle tone away. The worst part of the disease is that there is no cure. I was absolutely devastated when I found this out. I went home and I thought to myself, why me God I have been trying to do your work for a long time and now I am suffering with a disease which will eventually take my life?

I was sent to Froedtert Hospital in Milwaukee Wisconsin to confirm the diagnosis. The diagnosis was correct and they said they couldn't give me a timeline as to how fast or slow the disease would progress. I came home and went into a deep state of depression. Then I recalled that several years ago my mother came down with Alzheimer's. One day my father said to me, "This is my cross to take care of her", even though he was very ill himself. I asked God for help and he has been there ever since. Although I was depressed, I began to change and my attitude began to change when I saw all of the people from the guad parishes who came forward to do what they could to help me on this journey. Father Tony and the office staff did everything they could to make things accessible for me even though I had to walk with a cane. A parishioner began to give me holy water from Lourdes which I drank daily, it has really slowed the movement of the disease. We all have our crosses to bear but the gospel today reminds us that Jesus is always with us to help us carry that cross. My attitude has changed, I am no longer depressed, and I look forward to serving God and serving all the people of the parishes that I work with each day. I thank God for the gift of all of you who have stepped up and helped me through this process, through your prayers and also through all of your kindness.
