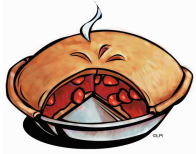

Thank you for your warm and generous welcome to the newest members of God's family!

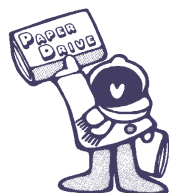

Not All Gyros Wear Capes



I was born and raised in Sturgeon Bay. At the time there weren't a lot of restaurants that offered a huge variety of food choices. In fact, the biggest choice I remember was between a Big Mac and a Hardee's ham and cheese. To be honest, that didn't bother me. Both were fine and my belly was always full.

Some time during my junior year of college I was having lunch with some friends and one of them ordered a gyro. I had never had one and wasn't real particularly interested in trying lamb. Besides, I didn't trust a sandwich that didn't even know how to pronounce its own name. It was a sketchy proposition, to say the least.

I'm not sure why or how (probably some sort of lunch table bullying) but eventually I decided to try one. **TOP 5 SANDWICH OF ALL TIME!** I was immediately converted. “Where have you been all of my life?!”

Yes, I definitely understand that this challenge that I faced was just a simple bite of a new sandwich, but it also underscored an important life lesson. Change is part of life well-lived. can be scary, difficult and anxiety-causing but it can also be a tremendous source of growth, joy and satisfaction. Change is the opportunity to experience new things, to discover unseen beauty and to live life to the fullest.

We have been taught this message at many funerals, through Sunday Mass readings and even when listening to the oldies station when “Turn, Turn, Turn” by the Byrds came on. Ecclesiastes 3:1-15 teaches us that there is a natural time for everything. It is not God's plan for things to stay the same, for us to remain stagnant and miss out on the infinite blessings that are given to us throughout our lives is quite the opposite of the joy that is planned for us. I'm not sure if it is our nature or our culture but many of us have a tendency to fight nature and rarely, if ever, does that bring us peace.

Today we find ourselves in another time of change. 12 has been replaced by 10. There's an empty chair in Margaritaville. Many of us are affected by the new school year, decreasing daylight and emptying gardens. Some of us are grieving the loss of loved ones or a turn in our own physical, spiritual or relationship health. Some of these things can be brutally difficult. Discomfort with them is certainly natural but no more or less natural than change itself. So, we are tasked to find ways to help ourselves and others to cope with them. Please take the time to recognize these hurdles and reach out for or to help. Help, too, is certainly part of the Church's nature and at the core of the Good News of Jesus Christ.

By the way, I'm sticking with “yee-ro”. I pray you know God's blessings and good sandwiches my friends!
