Restroom Upgrades at Annunciation and St Jude

We all know that there are people that have physical challenges and at the Quad Parishes we try to be ADA compliant or as close as we can get. Because the buildings are older and the schools were designed for younger grades, it isn't easy and can potentially be quite costly.

We have had requests for taller toilets in some of the restrooms and so we recently installed raised toilet seats which are mounted to the existing bowls. These seats give us an extra 4 inches of height, which we hope will help those who have difficulty getting up and down from the lower seats.

Two raised seats have been installed each at Annunciation and St Jude.

At St Jude there is one in the women's restroom on the first floor and one in the men's restroom. As mentioned, the seats give an additional 4 inches of height and have arms on either side plus the grab bars on the wall of the stall.

At Annunciation the new seats are in the men's room near door #5 (handicapped entrance) and the women's restroom, just inside the Kellogg St entrance to the church.

Hopefully these additions will help those who need help.

The Big Reveal

My absolute favorite time of the year is upon us. It is the time for harvest; the time of ripeness, the fullness of the season. The kitchen smells like fresh applesauce. Best of all is the leaves are all turning colors. Well, turning colors isn't scientifically correct.

I recall learning way back in second grade about how the green chlorophyll in the leaves uses the sunlight to process food for the trees during spring and summer. Now, as each day's sunset comes sooner and days shorten, the chlorophyl begins to die back and the trees begin, in essence, their long hibernation. Those who prefer romance might want to consider the colorful leaves as the trees pulling up their quilts for a good sleep.

Those who prefer hard facts will say that as the chlorophyll dies back, the carotenoids and anthocyanin that are present in the leaf then show their colors. In other words, the trees at this time of year do not turn color so much, as they reveal the colors that were present all along.

Those who look to creation and are moved to contemplate the Creator could consider that each leaf, in essence, undergoes a transfiguration. They are transfigured; in that, in October each leaf reveals an inner glory, a beauty that was always present but hidden from the eye. Just as Jesus, when transfigured on Mount Tabor, revealed the inner glory of his Divine Nature, which was always present but hidden from the eye.

This autumn season as your heart is stirred by the mutihued palette of leaves shimmering in the October breeze, perhaps it would be good to remember that because of your baptism that you are called to reveal the glory of God that lives within you. Each day is an opportunity for transfiguration. If our hearts were open to that possibility, it would make this undoubtably the most beautiful season of all.




