### Dear Quad-Parish Members:

*These past six months many of you brought in food to be donated to the Hope Center Pantry. Or maybe you offered up a prayer for the Pantry, the clients that utilize it or the volunteers that make it happen. For all of this support, we are so appreciative. The outreach efforts of the Pantry continue to grow as in 2023 alone, we have added over 630 new clients (so far).*

*On August 29, 2023 Thrivent hosted a "Thrivent Cans Hunger" event at the Pantry. The goal was to have 1,000 cans of food items that the Pantry was most in need of donated at the event. For every can donated, Thrivent would match \$3.00 to the Pantry (up to \$3,000.00). Thrivent dropped off bags at your church to fill with food items that the Pantry most needed. Bags could be brought back to the event and have a FREE ice cream treat! We had a beautiful weather day for the event. It was an overwhelming success. In only 3 hours we more than surpassed our goal by collecting 2,042 items!!!*

*Once again the Holy Spirit has perfectly situated our Pantry to have the donors, the volunteers and the food supply at a time when it is desperately needed. Right now this is especially true for older adults in our community. Over 40% of our clients are on FoodShares. Starting in April, older adults realized the impact of having their monthly FoodShare benefits fall from \$281 to \$23. So many elderly that have been affected by this are leaning on the Pantry to help fill that void.*

*It's hard to imagine what it's like to have to make tough decisions in regards to feeding your family. The food that the Pantry distributes consists of wonderful nutritious items. The clients are often taken aback with all that is available to them.*

*In November, we are offering to all of our Pantry clients an array of food options to complete their Thanksgiving meal. This includes such food items as stuffing mix, yams (sweet potatoes), pumpkin, gravy and cranberries*

*The way we look at it, we are cogs in God's big wheel, and we are amazed at all that we can accomplish with so many like you giving unselfishly! We leave you with HUGE thanks!*

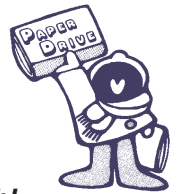

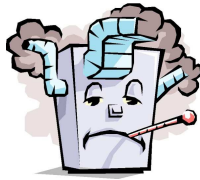

### Gospel Meditation

#### Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Lately I've been enjoying the deep meaning of Eastern icons. I love how they express a tapestry of meaning in a way that can surpass the written or spoken word. Today's parable of the ten virgins from Jesus is a good example. Try googling "wise and foolish virgins icon" and you'll see an image of how our Christ meets our heart's deepest needs if we attend to him with the proper attitude.

I'm serious. Take a moment to google and look at it. See how it depicts the risen Jesus behind a closed door with the five wise virgins with lighted lamps. He gazes with them toward the five foolish and lamp-less virgins, symbolizing the outward looking of divine love for the lost. Moreover, the wedding feast is no ordinary one. It takes place in a walled city and garden, indicating it's a new Jerusalem and a return to Eden. The table isn't typical, either. It's a Eucharistic feast. Now we see that the door in Jesus' parable is the way into the church, where Christ is the new light burning amidst the dark midnight of this world.

The richness continues. We notice, too, that the foolish virgins look *exactly* the same as the wise ones in their clothes, hair, and expressions. The only difference is they departed to buy oil and now they are sadly excluded. We often act like consumers in the marketplace to fulfill our need for love and mercy. We'll always end up disappointed if we shop around. Jesus sums up the moral of the story this way: **"Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour."** Watch, remain, don't spiritually shop. It is always better to quietly remain close to the Eucharistic community of the Church, even if we feel like our oil has run out. This week let's consider placing the icon of the wise and foolish virgins on our phone lock screen or computer desktop to help us remember to stay close to him, especially when life feels dark. — *Father John Muir*

**Do I Like My Job as Music Coordinator?

When I think back to the day of my interview for the quad parishes, I was extremely excited to have the chance to continue my musical life within the Church. Music has always been a part of life growing up in Manitowoc. I took piano lessons at the age of 10 from the Franciscan Sisters of Charity, who operated the Holy Family Conservatory of Music. Imagine back then paying \$1.25 for a half hour lesson, and if I didn't have a good lesson, Sister Lois would make come after school and practice there. Would that happen today? I took piano lessons for about 4 years, then took alto saxophone lessons for another several years. I played in the Lincoln High School marching band, stage band and pep band. Outside of school I was with a rock-n-roll band for several years playing the saxophone. After my junior year of high school, I had a calling to religious life and became a Franciscan Brother for 14 years (Brother Bonaventure). While in the monastery I formed a group called the Franciscan Cords band, playing polkas, rock-n-roll and, started guitar Masses for the kids in Pulaski Wisconsin. Outside of my regular duties and job, I began to write songs and started recording some of them. Our group came out 1 record album and 2-45's that are still being played today in England. (Shindig Magazine 2020) At present, I have been playing music in Church for 63 years, and presently play for my parish St. Benedict's in Suamico. In August of 2022, I joined the staff known as the Quad parishes here in Green Bay and, took on the role of Music Coordinator. Yes, I still write songs, and 2 of my Pro-life songs have saved a number of babies from abortion. Although my style of music is more upbeat, it's with this type/style of music that I hope/wish to bring our youth back to Church. Also, what makes my job pleasing and musically grateful, are the other musicians/cantors that work with me in developing our music liturgy. I may have to make some calls if there are not any volunteers to play or cantor for a given Mass. Some parishioners may not realize the time spent and practice these "faith filled volunteers" put forward. Do I like my job, "OH YES" it's great working for God our Creator, for Jesus our brother, along with the volunteers that have the same religious outlook as I. Also, I really thank my parents (deceased) for "making me" take piano lessons, I wanted to play guitar back then. But now I play piano, organ (with foot pedals), and bass guitar in a polka band.

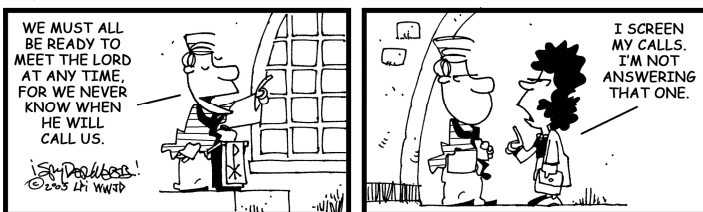
