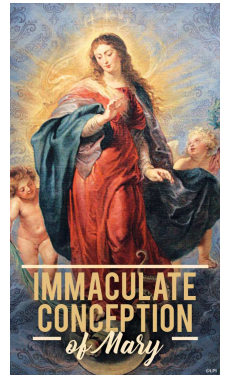

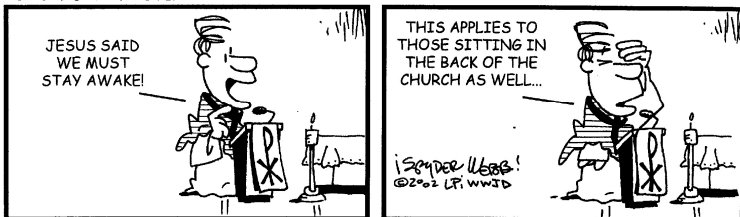

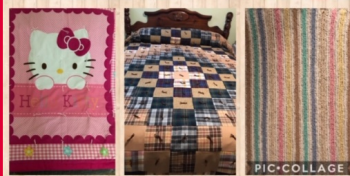

My Lord and My God!

When I assist at Mass, I have a close-up view of the beautiful ritual movements that are carried out. This is pretty cool for me because I can't see much at all when I'm in the pews! I have always appreciated the opportunity to be so close to the altar at Mass, even as an altar boy.



I remember, even as a young server, how moved I was when Father would raise the consecrated host, then the chalice, and genuflect after each movement. It was inspiring to me to see this grown man go down to a kneel in a gesture of humility, reverence and adoration. At some point, I was led to believe that Father would say "My Lord and My God" when he genuflected. This is an echo of Thomas's exclamation when he recognizes Jesus by touching His wounds. (John 20:28).

Recently I came across this note from Fr. Charles Grondin on CatholicAnswers.com. It gave me the actual facts surrounding this beautiful expression of wonder and awe. I also think it is a great reminder of the special and important role that each of us play during Mass.

Question: May a priest add the words "My Lord and my God, I believe" after the consecration?

Answer: No, those words of prayer are not contained in the Roman Missal and therefore should not be said by the celebrant. When a priest celebrates Mass he is celebrating the liturgy of the Church, not his own personal spiritual production.

The origins of this practice are that in 1907 St. Pius X issued an indulgence for the prayer "My Lord and my God" during the elevation by the priest. This indulgence, however, was for the lay faithful, since this prayer was not contained in the ritual book and to purposely stray from the ritual book was a mortal sin for the priest celebrant (De Defectibus, V, 20).

Today many faithful continue to piously pray "My Lord and my God" after the consecration of the host and chalice; however, there is nothing in the Roman Missal that would permit a priest to add any words at that point of the Mass. While the Church no longer holds the priest to the exact liturgy under the pain of mortal sin, the Church still forbids adding anything to the Mass that is not present in the Roman Missal (canon 846 §1).

"When a priest celebrates Mass he is celebrating the liturgy of the Church, not his own personal spiritual production". What a powerful reminder for us all! When we gather at The Table as the Body of Christ, we are uniting with Catholics throughout time and space. Wow!

Last weekend we celebrated the Solemnity of Christ the King. This feast is, in part, a reminder that we have a king. That we have THE KING! And Our King is worthy of humble praise. Father genuflecting, those of us, who are able to, kneeling and the faithful in the pews praying "my lord and my God" are all signs of the wonder and awe that we experience in the Eucharist at Mass. Jesus Christ is once again in our presence in a most special way at that moment!

This Advent, as we prepare for Jesus's birth, I pray that we can all be touched again by the wonder and awe of the immensity of God, who loves us so much that He sent His only Begotten Son to live among us, to teach us, to love us and to gather us for His Heavenly Kingdom.

Put Your Hands Up!

Last weekend we celebrated the feast of Christ the King. A time when we are reminded that Jesus is our Lord and, as such, we are to serve Him by giving Him the prime place in our lives. We are to love Him first and foremost. We are then to love one another as we love ourselves.



Recently we also celebrated Thanksgiving and observed "Giving Tuesday" as well. These days gave us a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the countless blessings we have received from Our King and how we are called to share them. In Proverbs 11:24-25 we read "One person gives freely, yet gains even more; another withholds unduly, but comes to poverty. A generous person will prosper; whoever refreshes others will be refreshed". This is a wonderful reminder of how good it is to give and how we often wind up receiving more than we give when it is done out of love.

As we move into Advent, toward Christmas, I would like to invite you to share your blessings in an intentionally Christian way this year. Please consider supporting a child, your church and a charity in a special way. You might call it my Ch-Ch-Ch-Challenge.

A Child: Our voiceless, unborn children are being cast aside at a horrifying rate. Those with a voice of their own are reporting feelings of loneliness, depression and anxiety like never before. Many are homeless, hungry, struggling with schoolwork, being bullied or feeling unloved. The most vulnerable among us are reaching out. Can you lend a hand?

Your Church: Our parishes are called to lead people to Jesus. We are better equipped to do this when we are spending less time focussed on maintenance, snowplow and heating bills. Our contributions are not keeping pace with our expenses. Like yours, our facility, utility and insurance bills have jumped. Perhaps now is a good time to start using those church envelopes or to sign up for automatic-giving. Do you already give regularly? When was the last time you gave your parish a raise? We, too, really need a hand.

A Charity: There are countless opportunities to support charitable organizations locally, regionally and throughout the world. What situations, people or causes do you have a soft-spot for? Who is doing the type of work that really speaks to you? A great way to say "thank you, I love you and keep up the great work" is to lend a hand by volunteering and writing that check. Our culture has Rugged Individualism roots, to be sure. We also have infinite examples of the positive results that come from joining hands in loving and caring for one another. It is what we are called to do, is it not?

What do you think? Are you up for the Ch-Ch-Ch-Challenge? Do you need some ideas? Spend some time talking with Jesus at Mass, during Adoration or at the red light on Mason St. If you open your heart, your ears and your mind He will show you how to share like He does! I would love to hear how you raised your hand to say "yes!".

I pray that you have a very fruitful Advent!

Dear Parishioners,

Advent has begun – a time for giving & receiving, and sharing with our brothers & sisters, especially those less fortunate. In the past we participated in a “Jesse Tree” from which we chose an item to give to someone in need.

This year with the approval of our Parish Councils, the Community Life Committee is sponsoring a reverse collection for the residents of Safe Shelter. The shelter serves any family in Brown County in need of emergency housing. Safe Shelter has 13 family rooms, with individual beds serving 2-8 family members. The building was a former credit union located at 2155 Hutson Rd on the west side of Green Bay. Families generally stay 30 days with a maximum of 90 days. During this time residents are assigned a case worker to help them find housing and other needed resources.

Below are ideas to donate to help families during their stay in Safe Shelter. Please bring donation to the marked container at church entrances or the Parish Office by 12/17.

In our current packet you may have seen envelopes opportunities to support and celebrate Maintenance and Special Needs, Snow Removal, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, and the Holy Days of the Immaculate Conception, Christmas and Mary, Mother of God. It is through your support that our parishes continue to meet the needs of many in our neighborhoods and beyond. I want to thank all of you who take advantage of these opportunities to share your blessings.

If you have gotten to the point where you would rather contribute electronically, please give the parish office a call and we can get you set up in just a few minutes. When you decide that you no longer wish to receive envelopes, we will take care of that, too.

Finally, if you already have converted to electronic giving but would like to support efforts beyond the regular “dues”, watch the bulletin for other notes. Or you can just look out your window, if it is snowing we can use a little help with the plowing bill!

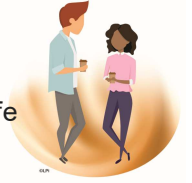
