

God is Near

When I began writing my blog, *Embers From the Fire* four years ago one of my biggest fears was whether I would be able to write something new every week. And yet, I have found that fear has evaporated somewhere along the way. I believe that is due to two realities:

- Our God is infinite. And, because God is infinite he is an inexhaustible inspiration.
- God is nearer to each of us than we are to ourselves.

A person who helped my own awareness of God's near and constant presence in my life was someone I never met personally. In fact, it is impossible that I would have ever met him in person because he lived in the 1600's. He is known to the world as Brother Lawrence. I met him through a book of his writings that were preserved for posterity by Brother Lawrence's bishop, and the abbot of the monastery where he lived for over 40 years. Both of these men were convinced that Brother Lawrence, whether ever to be raised to the altar or not, lived as a saint, and they thought his writings and letters would be a positive influence for others. They were correct because it is one of the bestselling books of all time.

One of the more interesting aspects of Lawrence's time as a friar was that he spent his entire time in charge of the kitchen. It was a task that he never enjoyed, even though he did it for four decades. And yet, Lawrence was an incredibly joyful soul who many people, including high ranking people of society sought out for spiritual counsel. He truly was an example that our relationship with the Lord has nothing whatsoever to do with our circumstances in life.

Lawrence recognized that God was constantly with him, and if so, everything he did was an act of prayer – his own method to heed St. Paul's urging for us all to "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18.

This is why the goal of Embers states in part: "What many people don't realize though, is that God comes close to everyone and he comes close to us every day. God longs to be in relationship, in communion, with each of us. And so, God is constantly revealing his presence with us, his presence within us. As God's own revealed nature is relationship, God reveals himself to us in our own relationships: our relationships with the world around us and the people we encounter in our lives. I pray that these essays will help you be more aware of the encounters you have with God in your own life."

If you haven't read my blog yet I would invite you to check it out at: www.embersfromthefire.com and I would suggest that if you want to have a greater awareness of God's presence in your life, that you make *The Practice of the Presence of God* by Brother Lawrence part of your spiritual reading – (hint) it would be a great Lenten action.
