


There will be a Mass with Anointing of the Sick on Thursday, March 21st, Annunciation Church at 12pm. All are welcome!

Less Me and More We

Earlier this month Bishop Ricken sent a letter to all of the parishes in the diocese. As you may have heard last weekend, Bishop has directed us all to pray The Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel after Mass. In the Pastoral Instruction on use of the prayer to St. Michael the Archangel in the Liturgy we are given a short catechesis on the history, need, efficacy and urgency for this beautiful and powerful intercessory prayer. This is a wonderful opportunity for us to increase our efforts to fight the battle against evil in our world.

As I read the instruction, one line really jumped out at me. It said "I further direct that in parishes where the Prayer is currently prayed at other times during Mass, that, as a sign of unity, the Prayer to St. Michael is prayed after Mass as directed above." Even more precisely, "as a sign of unity" was the part that continues to stand out.

I get the sense that we all have a pretty good idea of the benefits of unity. There are endless examples of the value and importance of working together toward something. Of course, the opposite is also true. When there are forces moving in opposite directions or working toward competing goals the best case scenario may be that nothing gets done. The more likely outcome is that there will be damage and destruction. A wise friend once told me that the devil loves division. He takes great joy in watching us fight against each other. In fact, when we do, we are actually doing his work for him. I couldn't agree more.

Why is it, then, that so many of us allow the chaos of self-centeredness, polarization and disregard for others to invade our lives? Why do we work so ferociously to protect our own interests while the suffering of others continues to rise? Our health, relationships, parishes, communities and our planet are hurting and we are causing it, or at least letting it happen.

Are we entitled to our own opinions? Didn't free will come from God? Aren't we supposed to take care of ourselves? Of Course! The challenge that we are faced with is to allow God's love so profoundly into our lives that our opinions and our cares are driven by it. When our love for God and for others exceeds our own gains, the wounds will begin to heal and the evil one will not find such a welcoming attitude among us.

Perhaps this Lent can be the turning point in our lives. Let us search for ways for unity within our homes, churches and communities. That we may turn the flood waters of greed and selfishness to that of the greater good for all of us.

The Diocese of Green Bay has come out with new guidelines for Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion.

EMOHC are to be appointed by the Diocesan Bishop. For this to take place several things will need to happen.

To serve as EMOHC, you must be a catholic in good standing, be at least 16 years old, fully initiated, you participate regularly in the celebration of the Sunday Eucharist and finally be a registered member of the parish in which you are commissioned. Upon approval by the Office of the Vicar General, the EMOHC will be appointed for a five (5) year term, renewable for one additional five (5) year term.

In the back of each church, from 2/24 until 3/10, there will be a signup sheet available for you to register. The week of 3/11 names will be submitted for final approval by the bishop. PLEASE take time to enter your information on the signup sheet.
