

This past month the Hope Center Pantry made alliances with two places in Green Bay that are working to help recently incarcerated individuals get the tools that they need to deal with their addictions and help them learn how to budget their paychecks so they can secure a place to live. Serenity House is for males and Amanda's House is for females. The residents of these places are encouraged to come to the Pantry for their food needs until they are back on their feet.

On March 5th, the Hope Center Pantry received a portion of the proceeds from the Brown County Food and Hunger Network. We were thrilled to get canned soups, canned chicken, pasta sauce, pasta and liquid hand soap. This food is donated by Festival Foods and Woodman's three times a year. Eligible pantries in Brown County share this distribution.

On March 7th, the Hope Center Pantry received 20 birthday bags for boys ages 6-10. The Pantry was in dire need of birthday bags for this age range so the timing was perfect! These were made up by the Confirmation class from Nativity of Our Lord Parish. Each bag was thoughtfully filled with a box of cake mix, a can of frosting, a pack of birthday candles, a box of theatre sized candy, two matchbox cars, and another toy. Now can't you just picture the joy this bag will give each boy that receives one? This gesture surely made God smile

We are so appreciative of the outpouring of donations from the Quad-Parishes during Lent. Especially the '40 Cans for Lent' challenge. Our shelves are getting well stocked at the Pantry thanks to all of your generosity!

When most people think about volunteers helping out at a food pantry, they picture those volunteers being retired (and old). Well, that isn't the case with the Hope Center Pantry. There are some local companies that allow their employees to take time off to volunteer. We are fortunate that some of those employees have chosen to use their volunteer hours helping out at the Pantry. These same employees step up to help out on their days off with special food drives (e.g. Postal Carrier food drive) which take place on Saturdays. Many times they proudly bring their families along to help out and see what our Pantry is all about. We recently had the good fortune to have a Sophomore student at Ashwaubenon High School earn some of his community service hours packing "to go" lunches at the Pantry in January and February. These lunches are then shared with St. John's Homeless Shelter. Lastly, we've had parents that are homeschooling their children volunteer at the Pantry during their school day as part of their curriculum.


We are extremely grateful to all of our retired volunteers. Working side by side with our younger volunteers makes for a very successful team to serve our Pantry clients.
