

Dear Quad-Parish Members:

Our praver of thanks to the Lord is what a wonderful thing it is when Quad-Parish parishioners continue to reach out to help the Hope Center Pantry clients. Each of you do not get direct credit from the Pantry clients that are helped out by being the recipients of your regular food donations. The Pantry clients receive this food and there is no expectation from any of you of ever having the favor returned. We hope that those we serve at the Pantry in some way do what they can to find a way to help others in this world. This chain of human beings so willing to offer up ways to help each other must really please the Lord. And although the hand we extend to help someone, and the hand that receives it, may never touch, we have to believe that the scales will balance. Somewhere, someday that other hand will reach out to smooth the way for somebody else. Lord, don't let any of us ever forget those who have given us a lift along the way. Let no day pass that we don't help somebody else. It's the Christian way to repay those who have helped us. This past month of March the Pantry was able to provide a substantial amount of food to 338 families which is comprised of 1,111 people (516 of these were children). Deacon Attire Update

Bishop Ricken and the Diaconate Director, Deacon Shaun Johnson recently issued an update to attire for permanent deacons in the Green Bay Diocese. As of April 20, 2024 deacons will have the option of wearing a cleric shirt with a Roman collar. The deacon's cleric must be gray, instead of the black that priests wear, and the deacon must wear a diocesan nametag to help prevent any confusion among the lay faithful.

I have informed Father Tony that it is my intent to opt to wear the Roman collar. I will only wear the collar when I am directly serving in my diaconal ministry. For example, you will see me wearing the collar when I assist at Mass, when officiating at the sacrament of baptism, or witnessing a wedding. I will also wear the collar when leading funeral vigils or services and when visiting parishioners in the hospitals or nursing homes. The list may not be exhaustive, but it covers the main occasions.

The main reason I am personally choosing to wear the collar is that it does more fully reflect that I have received the sacrament of holy orders, and I am grateful for the gift of being allowed to serve our parishes as deacon. The purpose of this update then, is to provide you with the background and understanding ahead of when you actually see me wear the collar.

God calls. We respond.

Fr. Mark Mleziva, Vocation Director of the Diocese of Green Bay, wrote "A vocation is a response to a specific call that Jesus Christ places on our hearts. It is our individual way of living discipleship in the Church. Our primary call, through the Sacrament of Baptism, is to be a follower (disciple) of Jesus Christ. It is to be a holy person. Within that first call to follow Christ, God calls us in specific ways to live a vocation to the married life, the single life, the consecrated religious life, or the ordained life."

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is known as Vocations Sunday or Good Shepherd Sunday, and is marked as the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. The purpose of this day is



to fulfill Jesus' instruction to "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Matthew 9:38).

While appreciating all vocations, this weekend the Church concentrates her attention on raising up shepherds for God's people - vocations to Holy Orders (the priesthood and diaconate) and to the religious life - while encouraging all who are discerning their vocation to pray more earnestly that they may hear and respond to God's call.

Knowing our purpose in life can be challenging, to say the least. From a very young age we are bombarded with so much noise that it can seem impossible to hear what God is calling us to do. Who God is inviting us to be. Often the trappings of life do not allow us to even consider our true vocation. How tragic, especially because this is where true joy lies. When people are unable to know who they were born to be, they, families, the Church and the whole world suffers!

As loving neighbors, we have an opportunity to do what we can to intentionally support those who are still discerning their vocation and to help to clear the way for them to say "yes". We can do this by offering a listening ear. We can do this by suggesting that someone consider consecrated religious or ordained life when we recognize that potential calling. We can also continue to pray for an increase in "yes's" and for the protection of and growth of those who are in formation.

The last thing that I think we can do to support an increase is to thank and support our religious and ordained. When people are supported, appreciated and valued it is that much easier to witness in a joyful and life-affirming way. Someone who is under-appreciated, overworked and not supported rarely is a good candidate for a recruiting poster.

Not all of us are called to the religious or ordained life but we ARE all called to support and encourage those who are. Please respond with your own "YES".

Summer Workshops for Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

All parishioners who serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Communion are required to take one of these courses by the end of 2024.

Beginning in June, the Office of Divine Worship, in partnership with parishes throughout the Diocese, is offering a second round of Liturgical Ministry training for parish ministers on the Vicariate level. These workshops will focus on training those who already serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion as well as those who wish to begin volunteering in this ministry. Below is the link to register; please forward this email to anyone who is currently serving as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion or anyone who has expressed interest in being one!

Important: Registration for these workshops is required.

Unlike other lay liturgical ministers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are to be commissioned for this ministry by the Bishop. This commissioning is proceeded by proper and sufficient spiritual, theological, and practical preparation to fulfill their role with knowledge and reverence. This formation is ordinarily provided by the Office of Divine Worship in partnership with the parish.

These courses will be the same as those offered last Fall; additional enrichment courses will be offered in 2025 for those who wish to learn more.
