2-1 lb cans chopped tomatoes

Brown meat, onion & green pepper; drain. Add beans and rest of ingredients. Cover & simmer  $1\frac{1}{2}$  - 2 hrs.

### I am The Bread of Life

Today we continue our 5-week walk with chapter 6 of the Gospel of John. Here Jesus declares "I am the Bread of Life". He makes it clear to the disciples, and to us, that "whoever comes to (Him) will never hunger, and whoever believes in (Him) will never thirst". This is Christianity! This is who we are called to be and how we are called to live when we take the title of "Catholic".

As you know, Catholic teaching is that Jesus is truly and fully present, body,

blood, soul and divinity in the Blessed Sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist. As you also have likely heard it reported, most Catholics do not believe in the true presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. This is why our bishops have called for a National Eucharistic Revival. We are in the midst of that now.

Over the past couple of months you may have heard of, or participated in, one of four National Eucharistic processions. The processions came from the north, south, east and west and converged on Indianapolis forming a cross over our country. When the



processions reached Indianapolis the 10th
National Eucharistic Congress was
held with the purpose to energize a
Eucharistic Revival throughout the United
States. Tens of thousands of
Catholics from throughout the country
gathered to refocus their lives on Jesus.
Each day offered Mass, workshops,
Adoration, community and service. The
atmosphere was amazing. There were so
many gathered in one place who were on
fire for our Lord and Savior that we could
literally feel God's Love all around us. On
Saturday, the Congress filled the streets

of downtown with a Eucharistic Process that was nearly 1 mile long. People lined the route 7-10 deep on either side of the street just to celebrate Jesus. The week ended Sunday morning when 60,000 faithful filled Lucas Oil Field (home of the Indianapolis Colts) to worship with Mass.

Of course, the final words were not of congratulations but of sending forth to spread the Good News of Jesus throughout the land. It is a call to all of us to fall in love, maybe for the first time, maybe again, with Jesus in the Eucharist.

# Was Blind, But Now I See: second in a series of reflections on the National Eucharistic Congress by Deacon Dan Wagnitz

The recent National Eucharistic Congress (NEC), held in Indianapolis, was much more than a meeting, or a conference or a seminar or retreat. It was a five-day intense encounter of Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist. Paragraph 1324 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "The Eucharist is "the source and summit" of the Christian life." The Eucharist then, is the focal point not just of our faith and expressions of faith (Mass and all seven Sacraments) but it is our very identity as Catholic Christians. The congress brought more than 50,000 people from all over the country together to experience that reality.

It is true that whoever controls language, controls minds and hearts. Words can both gain and lose impact as culture embraces them, cheapens them, or discards them. One such word is awesome. A search of the online Oxford Dictionary highlights this point. When used as an adjective, the meaning is: "extremely impressive or daunting; inspiring, great admiration, apprehension, or fear." When awesome is used as an adverb, the meaning is "extremely well" - my annual review went awesome."

I suggest that the common language of our culture today, movies, books, television, even education leans to the adverb definition – something that is good, but it probably isn't going to take your breath away. As a participant in the NEC, I witnessed 50,000 people experiencing the "take your breath away" reality of the awesome power of the Eucharist. How else would you explain that each evening when it was time for Eucharistic Adoration no one left their place. As Jesus was processed into the stadium, everyone assumed a posture of reverence as they were physically able.

When there was song, 50,000 voices joined the music leaders. When there was a pause for sacred silence, all 50,000 were so quiet that if a single person on the far side of the stadium coughed, you could easily hear it. No one left early.

The majority of the people joined in the outdoor Eucharistic Procession that wound through just over a mile of downtown Indianapolis on Saturday afternoon. People watched and waved from adjacent rooftops, parking garages and office windows. Patrons in restaurants got up from their tables to applaud.

And there were hundreds of speakers, breakout sessions, general assemblies where you could deepen your head and heart knowledge and listen to witnesses testify to the power of the Eucharistic Lord working in their lives.

It was a was a time to rediscover the real power of Amazing Grace. That old hymn hearkens to spiritual sight of the redeeming mercy of God. Perhaps to help emphasize that point for all of us, during one of the periods of Eucharistic Adoration, a participant regained their physical eyesight! Now that's truly Amazing Grace!!!
