Fall Fest Chili Recipe

Chili freezes well so start making yours now!

2.5 lbs ground beef	2-3 chopped onions
1 chopped green pepper	
2-1 lb cans kidney beans	3-15 oz tomato sauce
3-4 Tbsp chili powder	2 tsp salt
1/4 tsp cayenne pepper	1/4 tsp cumin
2-1 lb cans chopped tomatoes	

Brown meat, onion & green pepper; drain. Add beans and rest of ingredients. Cover & simmer 1½ - 2 hrs.

Cultivating Reverence in God's House

Our church is a sacred space where Christ dwells in the Eucharist.

"Don't you know that you yourselves are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in your midst?" - 1 Corinthians 3:16

This profound truth calls us to approach our church with deep reverence and mindfulness. Before and after Mass, we are encouraged to cultivate an atmosphere of sacred silence. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal emphasizes this practice to prepare our hearts for worship and maintain an attitude of gratitude afterward.

However, we often forget the impact our actions can have on those around us who are seeking a moment of quiet reflection. Common behaviors that can inadvertently disturb others include:

- Engaging in loud conversations or laughter
- Using mobile phones for texting or social media
- Allowing children to run or play noisily in the pews
- Rustling through bags or coats
- Arriving late or leaving early in a disruptive manner

These actions, while not intentionally disrespectful, can significantly hinder others' ability to pray and prepare for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

"When you pray to God in psalms and hymns, let what is in your mind be in your voice." - St. Augustine

This unity of heart and action should extend beyond our participation in the liturgy to our entire time within the church.

"My house shall be called a house of prayer" - Matthew 21:13

By refraining from casual conversations and maintaining a prayerful demeanor, we honor Christ's presence and respect our fellow parishioners' need for quiet reflection.

"When you are before the altar where Christ reposes, you ought no longer to think that you are amongst men; but believe that there are troops of angels and archangels standing by you." - St. John Chrysostom

This powerful image should inspire us to behave with utmost reverence in God's house.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life" (CCC 1324). Our behavior before and after Mass should reflect this central truth of our faith.

Let us strive together to make our church a true house of prayer, where reverence and worship reign supreme, and where each person can encounter Christ in the silence of their hearts.

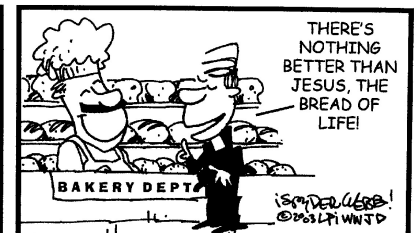

From your Finance Council:
Are you taking advantage of this IRS Option?

QCDs (Qualified Charitable Distributions) allows individuals age 70½ and older to make tax-free donations directly from an IRA to a qualified charity (for example St Joseph Parish) potentially satisfying all or part of their annual RMDs (Required Minimum Distributions). QCDs don't count as income—meaning you can't deduct the contribution on your tax return; they have already reduced your income by that amount—but the tax benefits could outweigh those of donating cash or other assets to charity. Does It Matter?: third in a series of reflections on the National Eucharistic Congress by Deacon Dan Wagnitz

“You attended the NEC (National Eucharistic Congress)? That must have been amazing! What was it like?”

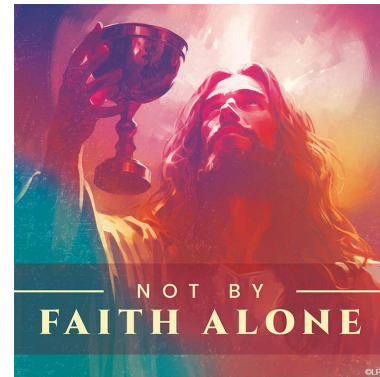
Those are the typical questions that I have gotten since my return home from the NEC, held in Indianapolis in July. But, how do you boil down five days and four evenings, dozens of presentations, the chance to hear internationally known speakers like Bishop Barron, listen to world-class musicians, and the opportunities to participate in Mass, Eucharistic adoration and Eucharistic procession through downtown Indianapolis with tens of thousands of fellow believers? It is so difficult to adequately share the experience. For much of it, I am afraid the old adage, “you really had to be there” is all too true.

Perhaps the biggest takeaway for me was a question posed by Fr Mike Schmitz. The NEC was a response by our bishops to the decline in the number of Mass-attending Catholics who believe in the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist per recent polling. Fr Mike offered the most challenging perspective of any of the speakers that I heard at NEC. He explained that the normal – and the most obvious response to that decline of belief in the Eucharist was to attempt to catechize, to teach the truth. The Church, especially the Church in America has been focused on that

for the last three years. All of that effort was the buildup to what took place in Indianapolis. Fr Mike then laid out his challenge. At some point, he stated matter-of-factly, it is no longer a lack of knowledge; instead, it is a lack of interest. Do we live our faith in such a way that Jesus’ true presence in the Eucharist matters to us? That really places the question squarely in our lap, doesn’t it?

This past weekend, if you attended Mass at one of our parishes, you would have heard me preach about an extraordinary experience I had with a drop of the Precious Blood of Jesus at the 9:15 Mass at St Jude in July. It was a vivid reminder for all of us that we do not need to seek Jesus; He is always present in every tabernacle; He is always present body, blood, soul and divinity at every Mass. As Mother Theresa was fond of saying, “The cross shows you how much Jesus loved you then; the Eucharist shows you how much Jesus loves you now.”

Jesus continues to show up. The Eucharist is perhaps the most visible, concrete way that Jesus proves that He fulfilled his promise to love us and remain with us, even until the end of the age. You know that it is true. The question really is, “Does it matter to you?”
